## Team Member Commitment



The National Urban Search and Rescue (US&R) Response System, established under the authority of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in 1989 is a framework for structuring local emergency services personnel into integrated disaster response task forces.

These task forces complete with necessary tools and equipment, and required skills and techniques, can be deployed by FEMA for the rescue of victims of structural collapse.

Salt Lake Urban Search and Rescue / Utah Task Force 1 (UT-TF 1) are committed to providing the Federal Government and the State Of Utah with highest level of trained personnel. By this commitment we ensure that the personnel involved with this organization will show the same level of professionalism and commitment.

In order to have continued success and remain a reliable resource to the federal government each team member is required to maintain 24 hrs of USAR sponsored and approved training each year. This training is not restricted to the team member's specialty and can be accrued through many different types of training.

The Task Force also provides the Team Member with clothing and equipment. This equipment must remain in the Team Members control at all times. Failure to do so will result in a recall of the items and a review of the Members deployable status. Shirts, patches and other items are the sole property of the Federal Government and cannot be distributed under any means.

Team members understand that they are contracted employees of the Federal Government and Utah Task Force 1 (501 (c) not for profit organization) during actual deployments. UT-TF 1 does not guarantee permanent employment and all monies distributed to members are on a contractual basis. All rates of pay are understood prior to entering in to this commitment.
